# Chasing Chinook and other Alaskan Fish Extreme

#### The differences are:

FISH STRINGERS are now stealable. If the card you play in your FISHING HOLE matches the top card of another ANGLERS STRINGER, you slap your own fishing hole and call out "*I'M TAKING YOUR CATCH*." You must do this before the other ANGLER slaps their fishing stringer to protect it. If you are faster than the other ANGLER, you collect their entire Stringer. However, if any ANGLER slaps their pile without having a reason to do so, they give each ANGLER 1 card from their FISH STRINGER.

**Bear Card:** If an **ANGLER** gets a bear card from their Fly Box, that **ANGLER** tries to place it on someone else's Fishing Hole. **ANGLERs** should try to cover their Fishing Hole with their hand to protect it. If a hand is NOT covering a fishing hole, the Bear wins. That Angler's loses their Stringer pile. Those cards are taken out of play. If the bear is too slow finding an unprotected Fishing Hole, then the bear card is simply removed from play.

### End of Game:

When a **ANGLER** runs out of cards from their **FLY BOX** stack, that **ANGLER** is done fishing. The **ANGLER** tallies up the points of their **STRINGER**. The fish are worth the value of the card.

### Except:

- If you caught more than two Chinook Salmon, you deduct 50 points from your score.
- YOU CAUGHT MORE THAN YOUR LIMIT.
- If you caught any Dog Salmon, they are worth nothing. Dog Salmon are not worth eating. They look cool though.
